Citizens of other countries who are not residents in Portugal can also apply. They must, however, hold a residence permit by the time set for their scholarship to begin.

What is funded?

- Call for PhD Scholarships aims to support researchers, in all areas of knowledge, who wish to develop research work leading to a PhD degree. Selected applicants will be awarded monthly stipends and supplementary support, which may include tuition fees, relocation costs, travel awards and health insurance, whenever applicable, as detailed in the Regulations
- Research work may be carried out in any knowledge intensive environment, namely in collaboration with companies. Host institutions may be: R&D Units, State Labs, Associated Labs, Collaborative Labs or Technological Interface Centres (CIT).

Obligations:

Applicants need to:

- Not have held any prior FCT-funded PhD or PhD in Companies scholarship of any duration.
- Have completed a Masters degree **upon application**, or alternatively:
 - Hold a first degree and a highly relevant academic or scientific curriculum, acknowledged by the legally capable scientific body of the university where the applicant wishes to be admitted, attesting to the applicant's ability to carry out studies leading to a PhD degree;
 - Hold an acknowledged academic, scientific or professional curriculum attesting to the applicant's capacity to carry out studies leading to a PhD degree, provided by the legally capable scientific body of the university where the applicant wishes to be admitted.

- Applications should be submitted online. Only one proposal per applicant is allowed.

 1. Completing EMU: how the euro area functions as a common currency area; improving productivity and long-term growth in Europe; opportunities and challenges related to the banking union, the capital markets union or other EMU reforms
 2. ECB monetary policy: conducting and implementing monetary policy in the euro area; optimal size of the ECB's balance sheet; assessments of conventional and unconventional policies
 3. Interactions between single monetary policy and prudential policies in the euro area: effects of prudential policies on the transmission of monetary policy; effects of monetary policy on the financial system; optimal coordination between monetary policy and prudential policies in the euro area

Obligations

- During their fellowship, the selected candidates are required to **write a paper** on a topic related to the Fellowship's research priorities.
- Lamfalussy Fellows are expected to present their papers at relevant conferences and, ultimately, to have them published in the ECB Working Papers series and in leading peer-reviewed journals.

Who can apply:

- Both academics and practitioners
- 2 types of applications will be accepted under this program:
 1. **Applications from inexperienced researchers**, which may include those with experience only as research assistants; **PhD students**, those without previous funding awards; those pursuing research degree studies or those who have not previously acted as a principal researcher.
 2. Applications from experienced researchers seeking to undertake a feasibility study as a preliminary to in-depth empirical research or with an idea/concept that they wish to develop. A feasibility study may include development of research instrument/research method, pilot study and evaluation of the wider research project, including reviewing issues that could impact its success. This would be conducted to assist the researcher in determining whether or not to proceed with a full research project.

What is funded?

- Funding up to \$5,000 for small Proof of Concept projects that will lead to more in-depth research
- Eligible projects cannot take longer than one year, however projects exceeding 6 months are unlikely to be funded

Obligations:

- Researchers are required to produce a 3,000-word practitioner-oriented report regarding their project
- Provide IMA with an article for one of its publications and an end of project report, detailing how the funding was spent, the results of the investigation and plans for future research
- Researchers who are not members of IMA and receive a grant are expected to join IMA before the grant is disbursed

What is funded?

- Maximum of \$7,500 per grant for projects that can be completed within 1 year
- Funding for research investigating topics of interest to both academicians and practitioners. Thus, considerable weight will be given to whether the proposal consists of a cooperative effort between academics and practitioners
- Grant funds may not be used for overhead or indirect costs
- The SIOP Small Grant award can be used in conjunction with other funding for a larger scale project. If this is the case, the proposal should describe the scope of the entire project, the entire budget, and the portion of the budget for which SIOP award money will be spent

Obligations:

- Deliver a final report to the SIOP Foundation within 1 year of the date of the award
- Synopsis of the research will be published on SIOP's website
- Strongly encouraged that the results of the research be submitted for presentation at the annual SIOP Conference

Proposals should not exceed 10 pages of text and must adhere to the following format:

- Abstract
- Literature review and rationale of the project
- Method – including information about the sample, measures, data collection strategies, and analytical strategies
- Implications for both academicians and practitioners
- Budget and budget justification
